

Executive Report

SkyLine Membership Corporation is proud to present this year's Annual Report, titled "On the Rise." In a year marked by challenges, from service-recovery efforts following Hurricane Helene to navigating broader uncertainties facing our communities, SkyLine and the members we serve have continued to rise. The 2025 Annual Report showcases service expansions to reach more homes and businesses, the immediate response of our communities to support one another in times of need and a sense of hope even in the hardest moments. As a cooperative rooted in service, resilience and innovation, SkyLine remains committed to elevating our region through connection. "On the Rise" reflects not only where we are headed but also who we are as a cooperative and as a greater community.

Since 1951, SkyLine's goal of improving the quality of life for those in the High Country remains at the forefront of how the cooperative operates. With a true appreciation for each and every member, it is our commitment to ensure that connection is not only available, but seamless, reliable and built to support the evolving needs of our communities. As our report highlights, broadband is a lifeline. It is more than a luxury in today's world; it's a necessity. We understand the critical role we play, and I can assure you, it is not taken lightly.

Despite challenges following Hurricane Helene, financially, your cooperative remains strong. In 2024, our consolidated operating income was just over \$14.5 million, and SkyLine consolidated plant reflects over \$369 million. With a healthy cash position, the Board of Directors approved over \$2.5 million in capital credit refunds to members and estates in 2024.

SkyLine continued expanding its service footprint throughout the year. Every step we take is guided by a commitment to reach areas where service is needed most as well as better meet the evolving needs of those we are already proud to serve. SkyLine Membership Corporation, its subsidiary, SkyBest Communications and Blue Ridge Energy completed a total of 160 miles of new fiber construction with \$7,750,000 in funding awarded from the Watauga County Board of Commissioners. This will bring service to more than 1,700 unserved and underserved locations in Watauga County, and nearly 800 residents and small business owners are already connected. In April, SkyBest Communications also made significant progress in both Johnson County and Carter County, Tennessee. In Johnson County, our latest growth brought an exciting extension to our incumbent area Shady Valley in both the surrounding

areas of Cold Springs Road and Doe Valley. This expansion spans more than 34 miles of infrastructure, bringing high speed internet to more than 900 homes and businesses in the region. In Carter County, SkyBest Communications completed an expansion in Little Milligan and Tiger Valley. More than 110 grant recipients in Carter County are already connected and experiencing the difference that high-speed broadband service can make.

In Avery County, SkyBest Communications was awarded an additional \$1,322,000 Completing Access to Broadband (CAB) grant through the N.C. Department of Information Technology's (NCDIT) Division of Broadband and Digital Equity. This added funding brings the total to nearly \$10 million in CAB funding received in Avery County. Construction is already well underway for this project, and customers in the Riverside Community are expected to be connected by the end of the year. Additionally, in Watauga County, Sky-Best Communications was awarded a CAB grant of just over \$1.2 million. This project is expected to bring high-speed service to 178 locations.

This report reflects our continued commitment to progress and the promise to stand by our members through every season. A cooperative is only as strong as its members, and we are proud to say that, because of you, SkyLine is truly on the rise.
